This feature-rich camcorder supports up to 4K video recording. Since continual battery usage is inevitable, this camera was chosen because this brand will allow you to operate the camcorder while plugged in to AC power. Reviews indicate the included microphone works well, but an external microphone is supported if deemed necessary. The bundle selected from Amazon has a tripod included. High marks for great video and audio quality and performance, especially for events.

- The size of one hour of 1080p video in quality, recommended for YouTube is 3.68 Gigabytes. 10 TB = 10,000 GB, so this would roughly store up to 2500 hours of video locally

Other notes:

Clearcreek uses their video surveillance hardware/software from a company called Digital Watchdog. Waynesville uses a video surveillance setup with DVR (CIB Pro 8CH 1080P TVI/AHD) but this seems to have been selected based upon legacy equipment. While this is also an option, it would be more complicated than necessary to accomplish the same goal.
